CHAPTER 396.

H. P. No. 503.

An act appropriating twenty-five thousand (25,000) dollars for building an additional cottage at the Minnesota Soldiers' Home.

Soldiers' home.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any Appropriation. moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty-five thousand (25,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of building an additional cottage at the Minnesota Soldiers' Home, the same to be expended under the direction of the board of trustees of said soldiers' home, according to the provisions of chapter one hundred and forty-eight (148) general laws of Minnesota for eighteen hundred and eighty-seven (1887).

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 397.

H. F. No. 497.

An act to reimburse Mrs. Mary Hoffman, widow of widow of John John C. Hoffman, for services rendered by said John C. Hoffman as first (1st) lieutenant in Capt. S. Ramsdell's company Minnesota state militia, organized at Sauk Centre, Minnesota, Aug. twenty-fifth (25th), eighteen hundred and sixty-two (1862), for defense against the Indians in the war of 1862-3.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That there is hereby appropriated out Appropriation. of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one hundred and fifty (150) dollars to pay and reimburse Mrs. Mary Hoffman the widow of the late Lieut. John C. Hoffman who served in the capacity of lieutenant in Capt. S. Ramsdell's company of Sauk Centre volunteer state militia, as per statement rendered the committee on appropriations, and for which claim this sum shall be full satisfaction for such services.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage,
