SEC. 2. The appropriation hereby made shall be paid upon the warrants of the state auditor, which said warrants shall be drawn only upon the certificate of the adjutant general. How paid.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

### CHAPTER 403.

H. F. No. 307.

*An act to appropriate money from the internal improvement fund for drainage purposes in the county of Pope.* Pope county.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of three thousand (3,000) dollars is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury belonging to the internal improvement fund, or out of the first (1st) money which shall come into the state treasury, belonging to said fund, not already appropriated, to aid in the widening and deepening of the channel of the Chippewa river in the township of Gilchrist and Rolling Fork and in the construction of suitable ditches, connecting so that said river and ditches may properly drain the swamp lands adjacent to said river. Appropriation for drainage.

SEC. 2. That such work shall be done under the direction and supervision of the county commissioners of the county of Pope and when the same is completed they shall make a full report of the same to the state auditor which shall be accompanied with a copy of all contracts, vouchers and accounts respecting the same. Work how done—report.

SEC. 3. Upon receipt of said report by the state auditor, showing the cost of such work, and that the same has been done in all respects in conformity with the spirit and intent of this act, he shall draw his order in favor of the commissioners of said county of Pope on the state treasurer for any money belonging to the internal improvement fund for the cost of said work, not exceeding three thousand (3,000) dollars. How paid.

SEC. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
