## INTEREST ON DEPOSITS.

The income from this source during the last fiscal year amounted to \$37,301.63.

## SCHOOL TEXT-BOOK FUND.

The legislature of the year 1877 appropriated from the revenue fund the sum of \$50,000 for the purpose of creating a revolving fund to carry out the provisions of the school text-book law, said law having expired by limitation several years ago, and the amount carried on the treasurer's books, under the head of "School Text-Book

Fund," amounting to \$47,546.49, should be transferred to the revenue fund, from which it was taken, and I would recommend the passage of a law to that effect.

#### TITLES TO STATE LANDS.

The state treasurer, according to law, is made the custodian of all deeds, abstracts, etc., appertaining to lands owned by the state upon which state institutions are located. I have procured many deeds and abstracts to said lands, but have failed to procure all. Some deeds are missing and many abstracts. In a few instances the deeds are defective in the description. I have submitted all titles to the attorney general for examination, and herewith adjoin a letter from him relating to this matter. In my opinion, the titles to these lands should be completed, and abstracts put on file with deeds, showing clear title in the state, and as there are no funds available for that purpose, the next legislature should make an appropriation sufficient to pay the expenses connected therewith.

Dear Sir: I have examined the deeds to the state of the property belonging to the state for the use of the various state institutions, and have to inform you that in many instances abstracts showing the chain of title to said properties are missing. This is notably the case in regard to properties secured during the early days of the state. As an instance I cite the state properties at Faribault. In order to pass intelligently upon these matters it will be necessary to have abstracts drawn covering all cases where they are now missing. This will, of course, entail considerable expense, but it is the only course that can be pursued in order to get matters in shape.
