

CHAPTER 144.

S. P. No. 315.

An act to amend section seven thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine (7869), chapter one hundred and twenty-seven (127) of the general statu(t)es of Minnesota one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four (1894), relating to bounties for the arrest of horse thieves.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section seven thousand and eight hundred and sixty-nine (7869), chapter one hundred and twenty-seven (127), general statutes of Minnesota one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four (1894), is amended by striking out from the first line of said section the word "two," and inserting instead thereof the word "one," so that said section seven thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine (7869), when amended, shall read as follows:

Amendment.

That the sum of fifty (50) dollars be paid to any person or persons for the arrest and conviction of any person or persons in this state, which amount shall be paid to the person or persons entitled thereto, on the presentation of a certificate, issued as hereinafter provided, from the clerk of the court to the county where such conviction was had, setting forth the object for which the same was issued, to the treasurer of the proper county, and such county treasurer shall take a receipt for the same, setting forth the object for which it was paid; which certificate and receipt shall be forwarded to the state auditor, who shall, at the next settlement, place a warrant for such amount into the hands of the state treasurer, to be credited on the settlement with said county treasurer.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
