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CHAPTER 264.

S. F. No. 545.

*An act to repeal chapter sixty-seven (67) of the laws of Minnesota for one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five (1895), relating to insolvency.* Repealing act relating to insolvency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That chapter sixty-seven (67) of the laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five (1895) be and the same is hereby repealed. *Provided, however,* that this repeal shall not affect the proceedings of any court in this state relative to any assignment already made, or insolvency proceedings instituted prior to the passage of this act, but that the same shall in all things be governed by the laws in force at the time such assignment was made or insolvency proceedings were commenced.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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CHAPTER 265.

S. F. No. 663.

*An act to encourage the cultivation of sugar beets and to prescribe rates of freight to be charged by railroads for transporting the same.* Fixing freight rates on sugar beets.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. All railroads within this state shall fix a rate for the transportation of sugar beets to any beet sugar manufactory, which rate shall be the same from all points located within a distance of one hundred and twenty-five miles of said factory.

SEC. 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
