SEC. 4. Any person, association of persons, or corporation, bringing children into this state contrary to the provisions of this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

This act shall take effect and be in force from Sec. 5. and after its passage.

CHAPTER 139.

An act to appropriate money for the salary of the Attorney general: second assistant to the attorney general, and to repeal salary of conflicting legislation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That the sum of two thousand (2,000) dol- \$2,000 per lars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine (1889) and annually thereafter out of any moneys of the state not otherwise appropriated for salary of the second assistant to the attorney general.

Sec. 2. That paragraph three (3) of section one (1) of Appropriation chapter two hundred eighty-seven (287) of the Laws of of \$1,500 eighteen hundred and eighty-nine (1889) appropriating hire repeated. fifteen hundred (1,500) dollars annually for clerk hire in the office of the attorney general be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Approved April 8, 1899.

## CHAPTER 140.

An act to provide for the election of county assessor in all counties having a population of not less than one hundred thousand (100,000) and not over one hundred and eighty-five thousand (185,000) inhabitants, and defining the duties and fixing the compensation of such assessor, and repealing all acts and parts of acts inconsistent therewith.
