## GENERAL LAWS

CHAPTER 356.

H. F. No. 666.

Incorporation of cities of 10,000 or less. An act to legalize the incorporation of cities of ten thousand (10,000) inhabitants or less, organized and incorporated under the provisions of chapter thirty-one (31). General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy (1870), and amendments thereto, being title two (2) of chapter ten (10), Statutes of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four (1894), and to make cities so organized liable for the debts of villages included within the corporate limits of such cities, and to legalize the acts of the officers of such cities in issuing orders and assuming such liabilities, and to vest the legal title of all the property belonging to such villages in the cities so organized.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all cities in this state having a population of ten thousand (10,000) inhabitants or less, organized and incorporated or attempted to be so incorporated under and pursuant to the provisions of chapter thirtyone (31) of the General Laws of one thousand eight hundred and seventy (1870), and amendments thereto, being title two (2), chapter ten (10), statutes of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four (1894), with boundaries as now organized, and all acts performed and orders issued by any officer or officers of such cities are hereby legalized.

SEC. 2. That when any city so incorporated includes the territory embraced within any incorporated village, the said city shall become liable for and pay all debts of said village, and the legal title to all property of said village shall vest in and become the property of the city so incorporated.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
