Provided, that where the bond hereinbefore provided Authorized to for is given with corporate surety, in lieu of individual corporate sureties, the treasurer is hereby authorized to pay annually for said corporate surety the sum of four hundred (400) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary to secure the same.

SEC. 2. That the sum of four hundred (400) dollars Appropriation for corporate shall be appropriated for the year eighteen hundred and surety. ninety-nine (1899), and annually thereafter, for the payment of the premium to be paid the corporate surety as provided in section one (1) of this act.

SEC. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. All moneys received by the county treas- Moneys deurer of any county in this state having a population of to go to two hundred thousand (200,000) people or more for road and bridge fund license for the sale of intoxicating liquor in any town of in countles of such county, shall be paid over by such county treasurer people. to the treasurer of the town wherein such license was granted, and all such moneys shall be placed to the credit of the road and bridge fund of such town, to be disbursed by such town according to law.

All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
