ceed nine thousand five hundred (9,500) dollars, shall be drawn from the annual appropriations herein made for high and graded schools in proportion to the respective amounts appropriated to each, which sum shall become available on the first (1st) day of August, one thousand nine hundred and one (1901).

For aid to state semi-graded schools, the sum of twenty-

five thousand (25,000) dollars.

For aid to state rural schools, the sum of sixty thousand (60,000) dollars, which amounts or so much thereof as shall be necessary shall be paid on the warrants of the superintendent of public instruction, drawn on the state auditor.

Provided, the first annual appropriation herein provided for shall become available August 1st, nineteen hundred and one (1901), for the school year ending July thirtyfirst (31st), nineteen hundred and one (1901).

Sec. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.

CHAPTER 190.

H. F. No. 544.

An act authorizing the judges of the supreme court to Btenographemploy the services of stenographers and to appropriate private money therefor.

ers for su-preme court judges.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. That each of the judges of the supreme court is hereby authorized and empowered to employ such stenographic assistance as he may find necessary to facilitate the work of said court, in an amount not exceeding (\$800) dollars annually, payable eight hundred monthly installments.

Sec. 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of four thousand (\$4,000) dollars annually for the purpose of this act.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after its passage.
