

CHAPTER 4.

S. F. No. 66.

An act fixing the salary of assistant county attorneys in counties having a population of not less than seventy-five thousand (75,000) and not more than one hundred thousand (100,000) inhabitants.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That in all counties in this state that now have, or that may hereafter have, a population of not less than seventy-five thousand (75,000) and not more than one hundred thousand (100,000) inhabitants, the salary of any assistant county attorney is hereby fixed at eighteen hundred dollars (1,800) annually, payable in monthly installments at the end of each month.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 5.

S. F. No. 47.

An act to amend section one (1) of chapter one hundred and three (103) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine (1899), entitled "An act providing for the issue of bonds for the purchase of sites and erecting school houses in independent school districts, and to repeal chapter three hundred and fifty-nine (359) of General Laws of Minnesota for 1897."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

That section one (1) of chapter one hundred and three (103) of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-nine (1899) be, and the same hereby is, amended so as to read as follows:

SECTION 1. That in all cases where the legal voters of any independent school district shall have, after January first (1st), 1901, at a legally called meeting, by a majority vote of those present and voting, authorized the purchase of a site or sites, the erection thereon of a school house or school houses, the erection of a school house or school houses or addition thereto on a site or sites already owned by said independent school district, the completion thereof, and designated the amount of money to be raised for such purposes, or any of them, the board of education of such independent school district may issue
