

such tax for the support of such library property, not to exceed in any one year one and one-half mill on the dollar on all the taxable property of such city or village for the maintenance of such library.

City may transfer control to library board.

SEC. 2. When said city or village shall have acquired title to said tract or tracts of land for such library, such city or village council or other governing body may by ordinance or resolution duly transfer all control of such library property to the board of directors of its library board in any such city or village, and the said board of directors shall thereafter have the care and control of such library and property under the provisions of chapter 106 of the General Laws of 1879 and amendments thereto.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 94.

\$195 for relief of John C. Devereux.

An act for the relief of John C. Devereux.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That there shall be allowed and paid to John C. Devereux, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, in full of all claim that he has against the State of Minnesota, for services as drillmaster and teacher of a military school at Fort Snelling, between the 6th day of July, A. D. 1861, and the 13th day of October, 1861, four hundred and ninety-five dollars, being compensation at the rate of five dollars per day in fulfillment of a special agreement, made by the adjutant general and acting quartermaster general of Minnesota, at the time he entered upon the performance of said services.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
