

## CHAPTER 41.

H. F. No. 35.

*An act legalizing certain county bonds heretofore voted to be issued and sold.* County bonds legalized.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. Any and all bonds heretofore voted to be issued by the board of county commissioners of any county in this state for a lawful purpose, which bonds have heretofore by said board been sold, are hereby declared to be the valid and binding obligation of any such county; provided only, that the issuance of such bonds was duly voted by a majority of the legal voters of any such county, voting upon a proposition for their issuance at any election held for that purpose; that said bonds are not to run for a longer term of years, or to draw a higher rate of interest than is by law allowed; that they are sold for not less than their par value, and that the total indebtedness of any such county, including such issue of bonds, does not exceed in amount, the indebtedness now authorized by law.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 42.

H. F. No. 70.

*An act to legalize the acts and conveyances of county commissioners in selling land owned by the county to religious societies for cemetery purposes.* Conveyances legalized.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That all acts, proceedings and conveyances of any board of county commissioners, wherein such board shall have sold land owned by the county to any religious society, for cemetery purposes, and wherein such board of county commissioners have actually conveyed such land to such religious society, and by the terms of such conveyance provided that when such religious society shall cease to use such land for cemetery purposes, the same shall revert to such county, are hereby legalized and declared valid.
