

eral Laws of Minnesota for the year nineteen hundred and one (1901), is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 4418. All probate judges whose salary amounts to or exceeds the sum of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars may receive a further sum to be annually fixed by the board of county commissioners, not exceeding five hundred (\$500) dollars, in any one year, for clerk hire; provided, however, that in all counties having a population of two hundred thousand or over, the compensation of the clerk of the probate court shall be fifteen hundred (\$1,500) dollars per annum, and there shall be allowed for additional clerk hire in such counties the sum of thirty-three hundred (\$3,300) dollars annually, the same to be paid in monthly installments by the treasurer of the county upon the warrant of the county auditor. And in all counties having a population of eighty thousand or over, and less than one hundred thousand, the compensation of the clerk of the probate court shall be one thousand (\$1,000) per annum, and the same shall be paid in monthly installments by the treasurer of the county upon the warrant of the county auditor. Provided further, that this act shall not apply to counties having a population of more than one hundred thousand and less than two hundred thousand inhabitants, nor to counties operating under special laws.

SEC. 2. Except as hereinbefore mentioned, all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 72.

An act to amend section twenty-two (22), chapter three hundred nine (309), General Laws of nineteen hundred one (1901), relating to an appropriation of six hundred (600) dollars, to aid in the building of a wagon road and bridge in the town of Claremont, Dodge county, Minnesota.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

SECTION 1. That section twenty-two (22), chapter three hundred nine (309), General Laws of nineteen hun-

dred one (1901), be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 22. That the sum of six hundred (600) dollars is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state treasury belong to the internal improvement fund, or out of the first moneys which shall come into the state treasury belonging to said fund not otherwise appropriated, to aid in the building of a wagon road and bridge in the town of Claremont, Dodge county, Minnesota. Said wagon road and bridge to be built upon the section line between sections thirty (30) and thirty-one (31) of township one hundred seven (107), north of range eighteen (18), west, and running from the easterly line of said sections to the westerly line thereof. The board of supervisors of the said town of Claremont shall have charge of letting the contract for and superintending the construction of said road and bridge, and when the same is completed, said supervisors shall certify the fact to the state auditor, who shall draw his warrant upon the state treasurer for said amount in favor of said town."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
