CHAPTER 147-S. F. No. 890.

An Act to validate the sale of bonds, legally authorized by any city of this state having a population of over fifty thousand (50,000) inhabitants for the purpose of extending and improving any water and light plant of any such city, at less than par, in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Validates the sale of bonds.—Section 1. All bonds bearing interest at a rate not exceeding four per cent (4 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually, heretofore legally authorized by any city of this state having a population of over fifty thousand (50,000) inhabitants for the purpose of extending and improving any water and light plant of any such city, may be sold at less than par and accrued interest, and if any such bonds have been so sold such sale is hereby validated and confirmed and the said bonds whenever issued are hereby declared to be legal and binding obligations of the city issuing the same.

CHAPTER 148--S. F. No. 730.

An Act to provide for the method of registration for all special elections, held in and for cities having more than 50,000 inhabitants.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Registration for special elections unnecessary—judges at last general election to serve—vacancies provided for.—Section 1. It shall not be necessary to make new precincts, to appoint judges, or to make new registration of voters for special elections held for any purpose whatever, in and for cities having more than 50,000 inhabitants, but the registration for the last preceding general election shall be used, the precincts shall be the same as at the last preceding general election, the polling places shall be the same as near as may be and the judges of election at the last general election in any precinct shall continue to be judges of election for such special election and vacancies of judges may be filled the same as in case of general elections, and such judges shall have the
