An Act to amend section 2087 of the Revised Laws of 1905, relating to storage and shipment of grain.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Form of receipt.—Section 1. That section 2087 of the Revised Laws of 1905 be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

Section 2087. Storage—Duties of Warehouseman—Receipts. Every public warehouseman shall receive for storage and shipment, so far as the capacity of his warehouse will permit, all grain in suitable condition for storage tendered him in the usual course of business, without discrimination of any kind. A warehouse receipt in the following form shall be issued:

 state inspection and weighing as pro-
 vided by law.

 Dockage shall not be taken on grain
 not subject to dockage by the rules of
 the state grain inspection department.

The receipts shall be consecutively numbered and de-
 livered to the owner immediately upon receipt of each lot or
 parcel of grain, giving the true and correct grade and weight
 thereof. Any provision in such receipt not contained in the
 above form shall be void. The blanks in the stub shall be
 filled to correspond with the receipt and kept as a record for
 inspection by the commission or interested parties. The fail-
 ure to issue such receipt as directed, or the issuance of slips,
 memoranda or any other form of receipt, shall be deemed a
 misdemeanor, and no slip, memoranda, or any other form of
 receipt shall be admissible in evidence in any civil action.

Receipt record.—Sec. 2. There shall be printed in red
 ink on the reverse side of such storage receipts a receipt to
 be executed in case such storage receipt is purchased by such
 warehouseman; and such receipt shall be executed in the
 presence of the owner of such storage receipt, and the ware-
 houseman shall also record such purchase as to the total
 amount paid and the amount paid per bushel on the stub
 record of his storage receipt book. Such receipt shall be in
 the following language and form, and any other form is here-
 by prohibited:

Received from Elevator company
dollars at the rate ofdollars

per bushel in full for the grain represented by this storage receipt.

All blank spaces in this receipt were filled in before the same was signed by me.

Provided that nothing in this section contained shall be construed to affect in any manner the conditions of any storage receipt.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
