Section 1328. Every school district treasurer shall give bond to the state in a sum equal to twice the amount of money that will probably come into his hands during any one year of his term, to be approved by the board and filed with the clerk, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his official duties. The chairman and clerk may at any time require such treasurer to give a new bond, and, upon his failure to give bond as required by this section, they may declare the office vacant, and appoint a successor; provided, however, that if the said bond so furnished by the treasurer be that of a surety company, authorized to do business in the State of Minnesota, then the amount of such bond shall be equal to the amount of money that will probably come into his hands during any one year of his term.

An Act to prevent the use of language intended or naturally tending to provoke an assault or any breach of the peace. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Abusive or obscene language a misdemeanor.—Section 1. Any person who shall use in reference to and in the presence of another, or in reference to or in the presence of any member of the family of another, abusive or obscene language, intended, or naturally tending to provoke an assault or any breach of the peace, shall be guilty of misdemeanor.
