

denn as unhealthy and unsuitable shall be used as a workshop, factory or place of business in which any person or persons shall be employed.

Penalty for violation.—Sec. 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, nor less, nor less than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, nor less than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, for each offense.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 290—S. F. No. 360.

An Act to amend section 1498, Revised Laws 1905, as amended by chapter 360, General Laws 1907, relating to temporary relief to poor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Relief by county commissioners in certain cases.—Section 1. That section 1498, Revised Laws 1905, as amended by chapter 360, General Laws 1907, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

1498. Temporary relief.—If upon inquiry such member be of the opinion that only temporary and limited assistance will be required by such person, or any member of his family, and that it will be for the best interest of the county to grant the same, instead of making the order aforesaid, he may allow such person or any member of a family relief to the amount that he may deem expedient, subject to the following conditions:

(1) No money shall be paid to any poor person under this section except that when transportation is furnished, a small sum may be given to such person to buy food.

(2) Relief shall not be granted to any one person or any one member of a family in a sum exceeding thirty-five dollars (\$35.00) in one calendar year, except that in cases extended relief is asked before July 1st and approved by the commissioner, the board may, by resolution, authorize him to increase the relief to the amount of \$75.00 and, by resolution unanimously adopted, authorize him to increase the relief to the amount of two hundred dollars (\$200.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary.

When relief is given under this section, an itemized and verified bill of goods furnished or services rendered, accompanied

by an acknowledgment of the same from the person receiving them, must be presented to such member. Upon his approval thereof, he shall direct the auditor in writing to issue his warrant for the amount specified to be paid out of the fund for the support and relief of the poor. A blank form for such bill, acknowledgment, approval and order shall be provided by the auditor and used in all such cases.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 291—S. F. No. 380.

An Act requiring town boards of supervisors to install one substantial culvert in cases where, by reason of grading a public highway, the same is rendered necessary for a suitable approach from abutting lands.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Town boards to erect culverts.—Section 1. That town boards of supervisors are hereby required to install one substantial culvert for an abutting owner in cases where by reason of grading a public highway, the same is rendered necessary for a suitable approach upon said highway over driveways from abutting lands.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 292—S. F. No. 387.

An Act to repeal section 3591, Revised Laws of 1905, relating to wife's interest in the lands of her husband in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 3591, Revised Laws of 1905, repealed.—Section 1. That section 3591 of the Revised Laws of 1905 be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
