

CHAPTER 316—H. F. No. 506.

An Act fixing the term of office of town and village assessors.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Town and village assessors to be elected for two years in odd numbered years.—Section 1. Town and village assessors in all towns and villages, except those operating under special laws, shall be elected in odd numbered years and shall hold their office for two years and until their successors qualify. All assessors in towns or villages affected by this act, elected at the annual town meeting or village election in 1909, or who are appointed to fill a vacancy, shall hold office until their successors are elected and qualified in 1911.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 317—H. F. No. 518.

An Act to amend section 38 of chapter 344 of the General Laws of 1905, as amended by chapter 469 of the General Laws of 1907, relating to fur bearing animals.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Destruction of fur-bearing animals.—Section 1. That section 38 of chapter 344 of the General Laws of 1905, as amended by chapter 469 of the General Laws of 1907, be amended so as to read as follows:

“Section 38. Mink—Muskrat—Raccoon—No person shall take, catch or kill any mink, muskrat or raccoon between the first day of May and the first day of November following.

Provided, that when any of the animals mentioned in this section are doing damage to or destroying any property, the person whose property is being damaged or destroyed may kill them at any time.”
