

CHAPTER 39—S. F. No. 461.

An Act to authorize the sale of certain land owned by the State of Minnesota, situated in Nicollet County, and being a portion of the St. Peter State Hospital Farm, and providing for the disposition of the proceeds of the sale thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Sale of part of St. Peter hospital farm authorized.—Section

1. The state board of control is hereby authorized to sell not exceeding three (3) acres of land in the northwest quarter of the southwest quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of section numbered twenty (20), township numbered one hundred and ten (110), of range numbered twenty-six (26), Nicollet county, Minnesota, being a part of the St. Peter state hospital farm.

Proceeds, how used.—Sec. 2. The proceeds of the sale of such land shall be added to and become a part of the appropriation for the purchase of land for state institutions.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 40—S. F. No. 479.

An Act to amend chapter 290 of the Laws of 1903, so as to permit the expenditure of certain funds therein appropriated upon a road, other than the one named therein, in Stearns County.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

\$100 for bridge across Crow river near New Paynesville.—Section 1. That the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) appropriated by chapter two hundred ninety (290) of the laws of nineteen hundred three (1903), to aid the village of New Paynesville in building a bridge across the north fork of Crow river on what is commonly known as the "Creamery Road" in Stearns county not having been used, the town board of Paynesville in said county is hereby authorized to expend said sum in the building and repairing of a road beginning in the village of New Paynesville and terminating at Koronis park in section twenty-one (21), township one hundred twenty-two (122), range thirty-two (32), said sum to be expended under the supervision of the town board of supervisors of the town of Paynesville.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
