CHAPTER 67-H. F. No. 42.

An Act to amend Section 4, Chapter 159, General Laws for 1903 as amended by Chapter 109 of General Laws of 1905, relating to pension of disabled or retired policemen.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

What persons entitled to pension.—Section 1. That section 4 of chapter 159 of General Laws of Minnesota for 1903 be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows, to-wit:

Section 4. "The pension authorized by this act shall not be paid to any person while drawing salary in any amount from said police department, and no member shall be entitled to said pension after he removes his residence from the United States, or who shall have been convicted of a felony or misdemeanor for which he shall be adjudged to be imprisoned or who is a habitual drunkard; and that any person receiving the pension herein mentioned shall not receive or be entitled to receive any other or further pension or relief from said association."

CHAPTER 68-H. F. No. 52.

An Act to provide for the appointment of commissioners for the promotion of the uniformity of legislation in the United States, defining their duties and providing an annual apppropriation to meet the expenses of such commissioners and of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform Laws.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Board for promotion of uniformity of legislation.—Section 1. On or before the first day of June in each odd numbered year, beginning with the first day of June, 1911, the governor, the attorney general and the chief justice of the supreme court, or a majority thereof, shall appoint three suitable persons learned in the law, who, with their successors, are hereby constituted a board of commissioners for the promotion of the uniformity of legislation in the United States, who shall hold their offices for the term of two years from the time they are appointed, or until their successors respectively shall be appointed; and any vacancy in said board, by resignation, death or otherwise, shall be filled by the appointment by said appointing officers, to fill such vacancy for the remainder of such term, of a suitable person having the qualifications herein specified for such original appointment.

Duties of said board.—Sec. 2. It shall be the duty of said board to examine the subjects of marriage and divorce, insolv-
