ting the said State Agricultural Society on a more orderly and business-like basis;

Resolved, By the senate, the house concurring, that a joint committee of five, consisting of two from the senate and three from the house of representatives, be appointed by the presiding officers of each respective body to investigate the affairs of the State Agricultural Society and that said committee be empowered to summon and examine witnessess, administer oaths, and a legislative stenographer be assigned to the committee when required, and do such other things as are necessary for a proper investigation and that it report its conclusions and recommendations to the senate and house of representatives, and that the testimony taken be returned to the house.

## JOINT RESOLUTION No. 8.

Urging the United States senators from the State of Minnesota to vote for and use their best endeavor to have passed H. R. No 29360, being the Sullaway pension bill now pending in the United States senate.

WHEREAS, The house of representatives of the federal congress passed the Sullaway pension bill increasing the pensions of the old soldiers who served in the Mexican and Civil wars, being H. R. No. 29360; and

WHEREAS, The members of the Minnesota legislature deem it a just and proper recognition of the services and sacrifices made by the brave men who fought in those memorable struggles; now, therefore,

Be it Resolved, By the house of representatives of the State of Minnesota, the senate concurring:

Section 1. That we earnestly urge upon the two senators from this state, the Honorable Knute Nelson and Moses E. Clapp to support and vote for said bill and use their best endeavor to have the same passed and become a law.
