

limit is fixed at two pounds in the round and one and a half pounds in the dressed state;

WHEREAS, The law of this state pertaining to the catching of whitefish places the size at two and a half pounds in the round and two pounds dressed;

AND WHEREAS, From the judgment of all those interested in the propagation of whitefish it is thoroughly established that whitefish do not spawn until after they have reached the size fixed by the Wisconsin statutes, and that they do not spawn just prior to reaching the sizes fixed by the Minnesota statutes, and that it is necessary for the continuation of the propagation of this species of food in the Great Lakes forming the boundaries of Minnesota and Wisconsin; that the Wisconsin statute should be amended so as to become uniform with that of Minnesota;

Now, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the house of representatives, and the senate of Minnesota concurring, that the legislature of the State of Wisconsin, now in session, be requested and urged to amend its statute so as to conform with that of the Minnesota statute for the propagation, protection and preservation of whitefish in the Great Lakes.

JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

WHEREAS, There is injustice both to the alien desiring to become a citizen and to the state because of lack of interest in the government of unnaturalized aliens growing out of the present difficulty in securing naturalization papers.

RESOLVED, by the house of representatives, the senate concurring, That we respectfully petition the congress of the United States that congress shall amend the law relating to naturalization so as to make it less expensive to the alien to become a citizen, and that it be so amended that depositions of witnesses may be used by persons removing from one place to another within the state, in the same manner that they can now be used by persons removing from one state to another before full citizenship has been acquired.

RESOLVED, That certified copies of these resolutions be sent by the secretary of state, to the president of the United States, to the presiding officers of both branches of congress, and to each of the senators and representatives from Minnesota.
