CHAPTER 158—S. F. No. 468.

An act to amend Section 1, Chapter 364, Laws 1915, relating to the filing with the register of deeds of bills of sale, instruments evidencing liens upon personal property, and satisfactions of such liens.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Bill of sale and other instruments to be filed with the register of deeds.**—That section 1, chapter 364, Laws of 1915 be, and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. *Any bill of sale, instrument evidencing a lien on or reserving title to personal property and satisfactions of liens on personal property,* shall be filed with the Register of Deeds in the county in which the said personal property is situate.

Sec. 2. **Inconsistent acts repealed.**—All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 159—S. F. No. 1000.

An act to authorize the superintendent of the state reformatory to furnish inmates with certain money and clothing at the time of their discharge from the institution.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Inmates of state reformatory to be furnished with clothing and paid \$25 each on being discharged.**—Upon the discharge of any inmate of the state reformatory, the superintendent, at the expense of the state, shall furnish each inmate released with one good, serviceable suit of clothing and under-clothing, and, when released between October 1 and March 31 following, with a good, serviceable overcoat; and he shall pay to each inmate, when released, twenty-five dollars in money drawn from the current expense fund.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
