CHAPTER 178—S. F. No. 527.

*An act extending the time in which local building and loan associations in certain cases may renew and extend their corporate existence.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Providing for renewal of corporate existence of certain local building and loan associations.—That in any case where a local building and loan association, created by and under the laws of this state, shall have within the period of its corporate existence, initiated in good faith, proceedings authorized by law for the renewal and extension of its corporate existence, which said proceedings were taken in the month of February, 1916, and were defective, and where notice of the meeting at which the resolution to renew and extend the corporate existence of the corporation was not mailed to each of the stockholders as provided by section 6342 of chapter 58 general statutes of Minnesota, 1913, said corporation shall have up to and including the first day of May, 1917, to issue a new call for a special meeting of the stockholders of such corporation, and mail notice thereof to each of the stockholders at least ten days prior to the date set for such special meeting, and clearly specifying in said call and notice the purpose thereof, to adopt a new resolution to renew and extend its corporate existence, and to properly certify the same, submit it to the department of banking of the state for its approval, and to file with the secretary of state, and to record the same in the office of the register of deeds of the county where such corporation is located, and to have the same published, all according to law, and upon so doing the renewal and extension of the corporate existence of such corporation shall be in all things valid. Provided, that the provisions of this act shall not apply to any action or proceeding now pending in any of the courts of this state.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
