

CHAPTER 167—S. F. No. 228.

An act fixing the clerk hire of the county auditor in counties now or hereafter having not less than thirty-eight nor more than forty-two congressional townships and now or hereafter having a taxable valuation of not less than eight million dollars.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Clerk hire for auditors in certain counties.—In each county of this state now or hereafter containing not less than thirty-eight nor more than forty-two congressional townships, and now or hereafter having a taxable valuation of not less than eight million dollars, as finally equalized by the state tax commission each year, there shall be allowed for county auditor's clerk hire as follows:

Three-tenths of a mill on every dollar of the first five million dollars of assessed valuation and one-tenth of a mill on every dollar of assessed valuation in excess of five million dollars, which clerk hire shall be paid in equal monthly installments to the persons actually rendering such service. The amount of said clerk hire for any year shall be computed on the assessed valuation of the preceding year and shall be paid in the same manner as the salary of other county employes. Provided, however, that the total amount of clerk hire shall not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) in any one year.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 168—S. F. No. 274.

An act to determine the amount to be allowed for clerk hire in the offices of the county treasurers in counties of this state, containing not less than thirty-eight congressional townships of land, nor more than forty-two congressional townships of land, and having an assessed valuation of not less than eight million dollars nor more than ten million dollars.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Clerk hire for treasurers in certain counties.—That in a county having not less than thirty-eight (38) congressional townships of land, nor more than forty-two (42) congressional townships of land, and an assessed valuation of not less than eight million dollars, nor more than ten million dollars, the county treasurer thereof shall be allowed for clerk hire for the year of 1919 and for each year thereafter the sum of nine hundred (\$900.00) dollars, to be paid in the manner provided by the laws of this state, relating to the payment of clerk hire allowed county treasurers.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
