

## CHAPTER 464—S. F. No. 1059.

*An act to appropriate money for the payment of claims against the State of Minnesota, tax and other refundments, certain expenses of the government, authorizing the state auditor to credit on pending logging permits amounts heretofore paid on certain other logging permits, all issued to the same party, and for other purposes.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act to be available for the year ending July 31, 1919, unless otherwise specified.

*In addition thereto, the appropriation made under the provisions of said chapter 464, Laws of 1917, is hereby reappropriated for the purposes of said act, and shall be credited to and become a part of the revolving fund provided for by this item as the same shall from time to time be paid into the state treasury; provided, that the state board of investment in disposing of such bonds may in lieu of the sale thereof exchange the same for United States Liberty bonds, and said revolving fund is hereby made available to effectuate such exchange.*

Sec. 81. The state auditor and state treasurer are hereby authorized to pay in the county treasuries of the several counties of the state on or before November 1, 1920 and 1921, the amounts due the respective counties as their share of the state inheritance tax under the provisions of section 214, chapter 209, G. L. 1911, and acts amendatory thereof.

CHAPTER 465—H. F. No. 1010.

*An act to appropriate money for the current expenses, buildings and improvements at state institutions, and for other purposes.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriations for state charitable institutions.—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, to be expended by the state board of control for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act, to be available at the time designated opposite each item.
