CHAPTER 19—S. F. No. 50.

An act entitled "An act to appropriate money for the relief of Mrs. Charles W. Robertson."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. \$2,000 for relief of Mrs. Chas. W. Robertson.—The sum of two thousand (\$2,000) dollars is hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the relief of Mrs. Charles W. Robertson, whose husband died as the result of disabilities received in the service of the state as a member of the Minnesota Home Guards

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 20—S. F. No. 55.

An act authorizing the board of trustees of the Minnesota Soldiers' Home to use any unexpended balances of any appropriations made by Section 3 of Chapter 463, Laws 1919, for any other purpose for which an appropriation has been made in and by said section.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Unexpected balances in soldiers' home fund.—That any balance remaining in any appropriation made by the provisions of section 3 of chapter 463, Laws 1919, after the completion of the improvement or work for which such appropriation was made, may be expended by the board of trustees of the Minnesota Soldiers' Home in carrying out and making any other improvement for which an appropriation was made in and by said section 3 of said chapter 463.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
