

## JOINT RESOLUTION No. 5—H. F. No. 28.

*Memorializing the congress of the United States to increase the amounts available, under the Weeks law, to the various states for forest preservation.*

WHEREAS, The necessity of preserving our forests is an extremely vital issue; and

WHEREAS, The cost of maintaining proper patrol has increased very largely during the last few years;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, By the house of representatives of the state of Minnesota, the senate concurring, that congress be requested to pass such legislation as will increase from \$100,000 to \$600,000 the amount available, under the "Weeks Law" to the various states to be used in conserving our forest wealth.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a duly authenticated copy of this resolution be transmitted to the speaker of the house of representatives of the United States; that another be transmitted to the president of the senate and congress of the United States, and also that copies be sent to each representative of the state of Minnesota in the United States senate and the house of representatives.
