CHAPTER 381—S. F. No. 624.

An act to amend Section 4001, General Statutes, 1913, relating to the State Board of Control.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Governor to appoint women on board of control.**—That section 4001, General Statutes, 1913, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"4001. **ORGANIZATION.**—The state board of control shall consist of five members, at least two of whom shall be women, appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate, each for the term of six years, and until their successors qualify. Provided, however, that the term of office of the members heretofore appointed shall not be affected by this act; and provided further, that the first term of office of one of the additional members provided for by this act shall commence on April 7th, 1921 and expire April 6th, 1924, and that the first term of office of the other such additional member shall commence on April 7th, 1921 and expire April 6th, 1926. Vacancies shall be filled by like appointment for the unexpired terms. The member whose term first expires shall be chairman. The governor may remove any member for malfeasance or nonfeasance in office, or for any cause which renders him incapable or unfit to discharge his official duties."

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 382—S. F. No. 563.

An act to amend Section 4175 of the General Statutes of 1913 relating to appointment of employees of the railroad and warehouse commission.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Secretary—Employees.**—That Section 4175 of the
