

dred (200) pages, and within thirty-five (35) days after the reporter shall have delivered to the contractor copy of the index of any volume or of the tables of cases in any volume, the contractor shall deliver to the reporter page proof of the copy so delivered, provided, however, that any reasonable delay in the delivery of page proof, caused by the elements or strikes, shall not be deemed or computed a part of said time; in case of any dispute between the reporter and said party of the second part, as to the construction of this paragraph, or as to the computation of time, the decision of the chief justice for the time being shall be final.

Sixth. That copy furnished by the reporter shall be definite and legible, and the contractor shall furnish the reporter such reasonable numbers of galley, page and plate proof as may be necessary for use in the reporter's office.

Seventh. That in case said contractor shall fail to comply with the terms of this contract, for sixty (60) days after written notice from the secretary of state of its default herein, that then, and in such case the secretary of state, with the consent and approval of the chief justice for the time being, may cause the work remaining uncompleted under this contract, to be done by other persons, and the expense thereof, over and above the amount agreed upon to be paid per volume shall be payable by the contractor to the said party of the first part.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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#### CHAPTER 510—S. F. No. 1042.

*An act to appropriate money for the conservation and development of the state's natural resources; for the maintenance, improvement and enlargement of certain state fish hatcheries, and for land for the same; for maintenance and improvement of state soldiers' home; for the maintenance of Minnesota department G. S. land offices fees; for aid to society for prevention of cruelty; for aid to Minne-*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. #### CHAPTER 511—S. F. No. 1044.

*An act to amend Section 4, Chapter 441, General Laws 1919, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 281, Laws 1921, relative to the printing of reports and documents.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Classes of state printing.**—Section 4, Chapter 441, General Laws 1919, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 281, Laws 1921, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. The state printing and binding is hereby divided into seven classes, as follows:

Class one—All bills for the senate and house of representatives, and all resolutions and other matters not in pamphlet or book form, that may be ordered printed by either or both houses, or by the officers of either.

Class two—The journals of the senate and house of representatives, including reports and other documents properly forming a part of such journals.

Class three—All other reports and documents ordered printed in pamphlet or book form by either branch of the legislature, or authorized or required by law to be so printed, including the volumes of executive documents and the legislative manual. The following documents may be published by the printing commission in the third class and in such form and quantity as it shall direct, but the commission may edit and condense any of them, or may decline to publish such as it shall decide may be omitted without injury to the state; biennial reports of the secretary of state, auditor, treasurer, attorney general, railroad and warehouse commission, and such other matter as any of them, by virtue of his office, is required by statute to publish, provided, however, that no annual report of any state department, or subdivision thereof, shall be printed and published in pamphlet or book form, except the *annual reports of the insurance department and the state agricultural society*, which *department and society* shall continue to publish annual reports as heretofore; all like reports of the board of control, insurance commissioner, department of education, public examiner, superintendent of banks, adjutant general, state librarian, expert printer, bureau of labor, dairy and food and game and fish commissioners respectively, board of pardons, commissioner of state parks and live stock sanitary board; the expense of publishing all of the foregoing documents and reports shall be paid out of the appropriation
