Minnesota, the sum of one hundred thousand (\$100,000) dollars, to be set aside as a legislative expense fund and to be used for the payment of the salary of the Lieutenant Governor, and for the payment of the per deim of the officers and employees of, and all other expenses of the Legislature, including payment of necessary supplies therefor.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

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CHAPTER 72-S. F. No. 190.

An act to validate certain judgments where jurisdiction has been obtained by publication of summons without filing affidavits before publication.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Certain judgments and decrees validated.—That in all cases where judgments or decrees have been entered in the District Court of this State where jurisdiction of any defendant has been obtained by publication of summons, and the affidavit of such publication has not been filed with the Clerk of Court before the issuance of the order of Court authorizing such publication, or before such publication, all such judgments or decrees, when otherwise legal and valid, are hereby made valid and binding upon such defendants so served by publication, in like manner as if such affidavit has been filed with the clerk, as required by law, prior to the issuance of such order and the publication of such service summons.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that this act shall not apply to cases wherein the judgment and decree has been entered since the 19th day of January, 1915, and provided, further that nothing herein shall apply to or affect any actions or proceedings now pending in any court in this state.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 73-S. F. No. 599.

An act to amend Section 7432, General Statutes 1923, relating to public service corporations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Purposes of public service corporations.—Section 7432 of General Statutes 1923 is hereby amended to read as follows:
