Sec. 33. Unexpended balances re-appropriated.—The unexpended balances on June 30, 1927 in the several appropriations heretofore made to the departments and activities named in this act are hereby reappropriated and made available for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1928 and June 30, 1929, respectively, for the purposes for which such appropriations were made.

Sec. 34. Inheritance tax to be paid to counties.—The State Auditor and State Treasurer are hereby authorized to pay to the county treasuries of the several counties of the state on or before November 1, 1928 and 1929, the amounts due the respective counties as their share of the state inheritance tax under the provisions of Section 21-D, Chapter 209, General Laws 1911, and acts amendatory thereof.

Sec. 35. Executive Council may borrow money.—Whenever it becomes necessary in order to meet the current demands upon the revenue funds for the payment of appropriations, the Executive Council may, at any time, prior to June 30, 1929, make such agreement with banks or other corporations or persons as they may deem advisable and necessary to pay warrants issued against said revenue fund, pursuant to any such appropriation prior to the time when the money to meet such appropriation comes into the state treasury and whenever any warrants are so issued for the accommodation of the state, and paid, the money necessary to pay interest upon the amount of such warrants from the time when such payment was made until the money to redeem such warrants comes into the state treasury at the rate agreed upon by said Executive Council is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 36. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 440—H. F. No. 1350.

An act to appropriate money for the conservation and development of the state's natural resources; for the establishment, maintenance, improvement and enlargement of certain state fish hatch-

eries, and for land for the same; for maintenance and improvement of state soldier's home; for the maintenance of Minnesota Department, G. A. R.; for expense of burial of soldiers and sailors; for maintenance, improvement and repairs, Minnesota State Agricultural Society; for county and district agricultural societies; for various stock breeders, dairymen's, horticultural and poultry associations and societies, farmers' institutes; for public parks and additions thereto and for the establishment of new public parks; for sheriff's per diem and mileage in certain cases; for wolf bounties; for drainage and highway assessments upon state lands; for vessel tonnage tax; for fees public land collections; for aid to Minnesota tourist bureau; for maintenance Sibley House; for maintenance of various semi-state activities; for maintenance of various state departments and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota :

Section 1. **Appropriation of conservation and development of natural resources, etc.**—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the purposes specified, in the following sections of this act, to be available, when not otherwise stated, for each of the fiscal years ending June 30, 1928, and June 30, 1929.

Said sum to be expended during the year 1928 for the construction of a road from said fish hatchery to the Point Douglas Road, provided, that said sum shall be available for said purpose and shall be so expended upon condition that the City of St. Paul shall first execute and deliver to the governor of the State of Minnesota a written agreement providing that upon the expenditure of said sum during the year 1928 for the construction of such road in accordance with plans approved by the Commissioner of Highways, the same shall be deemed a full compliance by the state with all the conditions and provisions relating to the opening, building and maintenance of such a road, as contained in the deed of the fish hatchery premises from the City of St. Paul to the State of Minnesota, dated March 28, 1911, re-

corded in the office of the register of deeds of Ramsey County, Minnesota, in book 581 of deeds, page 16, and now on file in the office of the state auditor, and that said city waives any default on the part of the state for failure to construct such road within the time specified in said deed, and releases the state from any further obligation under said deed to construct or maintain such road after the expenditure of said sum for the construction of such road as hereinbefore provided.

Provided, that should the Minnesota State Poultry Association of Hennepin Coun-

ty and the Minnesota Fanciers Association of Ramsey County combine and file an affidavit to that effect with the state auditor, they shall hereafter be recognized as one association, known as the "Minnesota State Poultry Association" which association shall hold one show annually and shall be allowed, by the State Auditor, the aid herein allowed, these two aforesaid former associations under the provisions of this act.

Provided, that no one association or society shall receive an amount greater than the annual premiums paid to exhibitors by them and shall not in any case exceed the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400.00) to any one county. Provided, further, that any society or association to be entitled to their distributive share of this appropriation shall file annually with the state auditor, on or before the first day of April of each year, a sworn statement signed by the president or secretary of such association or society, showing the amount of cash premiums paid during the year to exhibitors, and the amount to be distributed to such society or association from said fund shall be based and determined upon the amount of cash premiums paid out as hereinbefore provided. Provided further, that where there is more than one association in a county the amount allotted to such county, not exceeding four hundred dollars (\$400.00) aforesaid, shall be distributed to the societies in equal amounts.

*An act to appropriate money for maintenance, buildings and
improvements at state institutions, for expenses of the Board of*
