

CHAPTER 12—H. F. No. 107

An act to amend Subdivision (4), Section 2816, General Statutes 1923, relating to powers of the school board.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. To provide for transportation.—That subdivision (4), Section 2816, General Statutes 1923, be, and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"4. Provided for the free transportation of *pupils* to and from school, and to schools in other districts for grades and departments not maintained in the district, including high school, at the expense of the district, provided funds for such purpose are available and if agreeable to district to which it is proposed to transport the *pupils*, for the whole or such part of the school year as they may deem expedient, and subject to such rules and regulations as they may adopt; and they shall require from every person employed for that purpose, a reasonable bond for the faithful discharge of his duties, as prescribed by the board."

CHAPTER 13—S. F. No. 54

An act to amend General Statutes 1923, Section 9468, relating to selection of jurors.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Selection of jurors.—That General Statutes 1923, Section 9468, be amended to read as follows:

"9468. The county board, at its annual session in January, shall select, from the qualified voters of the county, seventy-two persons to serve as grand jurors, and one hundred and forty-four persons to serve as petit jurors, and make separate lists thereof, which shall be certified and signed by the chairman, attested by the auditor, and forthwith delivered to the clerk of the district court. If in any county the board is unable to select the required number, the highest practicable number shall be sufficient. In counties where population exceeds ten thousand no person on such list drawn for service shall be placed on the next succeeding annual list, and the clerk shall certify to the board at its annual January session the names on the last annual list not drawn for service during the preceding year, nor shall any juror at any one term serve more than thirty days and until the completion of the case upon which he may be sitting and in counties having two or more terms of court in one year, after the jurors have been drawn for any term of such court, the clerk shall strike from the original list the names of all persons who were drawn for such term, and notify the board thereof, which at its next session shall likewise
