counties, if any, on account of the funds expended by them in erecting and equipping the sanatorium being maintained and operated by them. The conditions agreed upon shall be set forth in writing and submitted to the county board of each county involved and if approved by the majority of the county boards, resolutions to that effect shall be adopted and upon the adoption of such resolution by the new county to be admitted and by a majority of the counties already within such group, the conditions agreed upon shall be binding on all such counties and the applying county shall become attached to such group. After such resolutions are adopted certified copies thereof shall be filed in the office of the advisory commission of the Minnesota Sanatorium for Consumptives."

CHAPTER 7-H. F. No. 98

An act to enlarge the boundaries of Minneopa State Park.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section I. Boundaries of Minneopa State Park.—That the boundaries of Minneopa State Park, as established and created by General Laws 1905, Chapter 297, and as enlarged by General Laws 1909, Chapter 409, and by General Laws 1917, Chapter 157, be and the same hereby are enlarged by adding to said park the following land situate in Blue Earth County, Minnesota, to-wit:

Commencing at a point eight hundred thirty-five (835) feet west and ten hundred eighty-seven (1,087) feet south of the northeast corner of section eighteen (18), township one hundred eight (108) north of range twenty-seven (27) west, thence at an angle of one hundred twenty-two (122) degrees seventeen (17) minutes right (north sixty-three (63) degrees west) seven hundred seventy-two (772) feet to a point on the north side of highway; thence along the north side of highway one hundred fifty-eight (158) degrees thirty-one (31) minutes left (south forty-one (41) degrees forty-five (45) minutes east) three hundred forty-five and 7/10 (345.7) feet, thence thirty-four (34) degrees thirty-six (36) minutes left (south seventy-six (76) degrees thirty (30) minutes east) four hundred seventy-four and 8/10 (474.8) feet; thence one hundred ten (110) degrees thirty-six (36) minutes left (north five (5) degrees forty-five (45) minutes west, twenty-three (23) feet to the place of beginning, containing about one and 24/100 acres of land.

Sec. 2. State auditor may accept gifts.—The state auditor is hereby authorized to accept a gift of said lands from the Blue Earth County Historical Society, and said lands are by this act dedicated to the

perpetual use of the State of Minnesota as a State park under the restrictions now provided or which may hereafter be provided by law.

CHAPTER 8-S. F. No. 6

An act authorizing the transfer of county funds in order to pay pensions awarded under Laws 1929, Chapter 47, and authorizing pension payments to be carried as overdrafts until funds shall be available to pay the same.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Transfer of county funds.—Any county may transfer surplus funds from any county fund except the sinking fund or ditch fund to the general fund or to a special old age pension fund in order to provide moneys necessary to pay pensions awarded under Laws 1929, Chapter 47. The money so transferred shall be used for no other purpose, but any portion thereof no longer needed for such purpose may be transferred back to the fund from which taken. When necessary by reason of failure to levy sufficient taxes for payment of said old age pensions in the county, the county board may authorize the payment of said pensions and the county auditor may carry any such payments as an overdraft on the old age pension fund of said county until sufficient tax funds shall be provided for said old age pension payments.

CHAPTER 9-H. F. No. 164

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 7677, relating to loans, investments and discounts of State banks.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Restriction upon total liability of individuals to bank—Loans on first mortgage security on improved real estate —Liability of officers or directors to bank—Discounts authorized —Permitting creation of excess liability—Penalty and civil liability.—That Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 7677, be amended to read as follows:

"7677. The total liabilities to it, as principal, surety, or endorser of any person, corporation, or copartnership, including the liabilities of the several members thereof, shall never exceed fifteen (15)
