

CHAPTER 106—H. F. No. 1276

An act to amend Laws 1931, Chapter 79, Section 2, relating to the state office building and the location of the site therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Location of state office building.**—That Laws 1931, Chapter 79, Section 2, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 2. The building shall be located south of Aurora avenue and contiguous to the capitol grounds. The commission is hereby authorized to acquire the needed lands at a price satisfactory to the commission. The commission may acquire the lands by right of eminent domain, including lands embraced in present streets or highways within or adjacent to the site to be thus acquired essential to or convenient for the use and enjoyment of the building so to be erected. *If the site selected shall include the part of St. Peter street to the north of the south line of Fuller avenue, if extended from Rice street to St. Peter street, then the commission may include therein all or a part of the land embraced between the north and south lines of said Fuller avenue, as so extended, and by agreement with the city of St. Paul, by way of exchange for the part of St. Peter street so acquired, may permit the city to open, extend and maintain as an outlet street the said Fuller avenue, to the width so acquired, between Rice street and St. Peter street.*”

CHAPTER 107—S. F. No. 180

An act authorizing the renewal of the period of corporate existence of certain corporations whose period of duration has expired without the renewal thereof, and legalizing acts and contracts of such corporation made or done and performed subsequent to the expiration of the original period of existence of such corporations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Corporations may renew corporate existence.**—Any corporation heretofore organized, for pecuniary profit, and social corporations under the laws of this State, whose period of duration has expired less than *ten (10)* years prior to the passage of this act and the same has not been renewed and such corporation has continued to transact its business, may renew its corporate existence from the date of the expiration of its period of duration for an

additional period not exceeding thirty (30) years from and after the time of its expired period of duration, with the same force and effect as if renewed prior to the expiration of its term of existence, by taking the same proceedings and by paying into the state treasury the same incorporation fees as now provided by law for the renewal of the corporate existence of such corporations in cases where such renewal is made before the end of its period of duration.

Sec. 2. Proceedings — when taken.—Such proceedings to obtain such extension shall be taken within six (6) months after the approval of this act.

Sec. 3. To be retroactive.—When such steps are taken within such period, such proceedings shall relate back to the date of the expiration of said original corporate period, and when said period is extended as provided by this act any and all corporate acts and contracts done, performed, made and entered into after the expiration of said original period, shall be, and each is hereby declared to be legal and valid.

Sec. 4. Application.—This act shall not apply to any corporation the charter of which has been declared forfeited by the final judgment of any court of competent jurisdiction of this State, nor to any corporation as to which there is *pending* any action or proceeding to any of the courts of this State, for the forfeiture of its charter, nor *shall this act affect* any action or proceeding now pending in any of the Courts of this State *in relation to any corporation described in Section 1 of this act.*

Sec. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 108—S. F. No. 755

An act authorizing the renewal of the period of corporate existence of certain incorporated creamery associations.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Corporate existence of certain creamery associations renewed.—Any incorporated Creamery Association, whose period of duration has expired less than two years before the passage of this act, and which has continued to carry on its business without a renewal of its said period, and has heretofore attempted to renew the period of its corporate existence for a period not
