

AND WHEREAS, the enactment of such bill by Congress would be a very definite contribution towards restoring our dairy industry upon a sound basis, first, because of enlarging our domestic butter market and second, because of the moral supporting influence it would have, which is of great importance and far reaching effect, and to which the dairy industry of our State and nation feels they are entitled.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives, of the State of Minnesota, the Senate concurring herein, that we do hereby respectfully petition and urge Congress to pass and enact said H. R. 16470.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State be instructed to forward a copy hereof to the President of the United States, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, the Chairman of the Committees of agriculture of the Senate and House respectively and to each of the Senators and Representatives of the State of Minnesota in said Congress of the United States.

RESOLUTION No. 16—H. F. No. 290

*Joint resolution requesting the Governor to proclaim October 11th of each year "General Pulaski's Memorial Day" for the observance and commemoration of the death of Brigadier General Casimir Pulaski.*

WHEREAS, the 11th day of October, 1779, is the date in American history of the heroic death of Brigadier General Casimir Pulaski, who died from wounds received on October 9th, 1779, at the siege of Savannah, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, the States of Indiana, Wisconsin, Michigan, Ohio, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, New York, Minnesota, Maryland, New Jersey, Illinois, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Nebraska, Georgia, and other States of the Union have by legislative enactment designated October 11, 1929, to be "General Pulaski's Memorial Day"; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that the recurring anniversary of this day be commemorated with suitable patriotic and public exercises in observing and commemorating the death of this great American hero of the Revolutionary War; and

WHEREAS, the United States Pulaski Sesquicentennial Commission heretofore created by Congress recommends to the States that such observance and exercises be held;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, that the Governor of the State of Minnesota is authorized and requested to issue a proclamation calling upon officials of the Government to display the flag of the United States on all governmental buildings on October 11th of each year and inviting the people of the State of Minnesota to observe the day in schools and churches, or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies in commemoration of the death of General Casimir Pulaski.

RESOLUTION No. 17—H. F. No. 1521

*Concurrent resolution providing for a joint session of the Senate and the House of Representatives for the purpose of electing a member of the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota.*

BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the House of Representatives and the Senate meet in joint session on April 17th at 11:30 A. M. for the purpose of electing one member of the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota from the Seventh Congressional District to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Samuel Lewison for the unexpired term of said Regent.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the President and the Speaker of the House each appoint a committee of eleven, one from each Congressional District in the State and one at large, the persons so appointed to be and act as a joint nominating committee to recom-
