

meet their taxes and assessments, and the tax burdens of such regions have hereby been increased beyond the capacity of farmers generally to pay, and the agricultural depression in such regions has thereby been greatly aggravated;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the house of representatives of the state of Minnesota, the senate concurring, that we most earnestly urge the congress of the United States to pass said pending measure at the earliest possible time.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the secretary of state of Minnesota be instructed to send copies of this resolution to both houses of congress and to each member in congress from the state of Minnesota.

RESOLUTION No. 3—S. F. No. 60

*A resolution memorializing Congress to enact that certain bill now pending known as H. R. 15934, relating to the manufacture and sale of oleomargarine and restricting the use of palm oil in the manufacture thereof.*

WHEREAS, there is now pending before the Congress of the United States a certain bill known as H. R. 15934, the purpose and intent of which is to prohibit the use of palm oil in the manufacture of oleomargarine and its products; and whereas the enactment of such bill by Congress will be of great benefit to the dairying interests of the state of Minnesota,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, the Senate concurring herein, that we do hereby respectfully petition and urge Congress to pass and enact said H. R. 15934.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the chief clerk be instructed to forward a copy hereof to each of the senators and representatives of the state of Minnesota in said Congress of the United States.
