

CHAPTER 17—S. F. No. 109

An act to repeal General Laws 1915, Chapter 211, giving preference to Minnesota materials in the construction of public buildings.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law repealed.**—That General Laws 1915, Chapter 211, be and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 18—S. F. No. 233

An act repealing General Laws 1925, Chapter 189, requiring cut stone used in the construction of public buildings to be fabricated within the state.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law repealed.**—The General Laws 1925, Chapter 189, be and the same is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 19—S. F. No. 262

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes, 1927, Section 3167, relating to powers of County Board to appoint an Overseer of the Poor in counties where no poor house is established.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Overseer of poor maybe appointed in certain counties.**—That Mason's Minnesota Statutes, 1927, Section 3167, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

"3167. When a poorhouse is established, the County Board shall appoint, for the term of one year, and may at pleasure remove, an overseer of the poor, who shall hold office until his successor qualifies, and whose compensation shall be fixed by the board annually. In a county, or counties, where no poorhouse is established, the County Board may appoint for the term of one year, and may at its pleasure remove, an overseer of the poor, who shall hold office until his successor qualifies, and his compensation shall be fixed by the
