

CHAPTER 35—H. F. No. 155

An act to provide for the classification of employees of the Board of Education of any independent school district in any city of the first class in the State of Minnesota, the territorial limits of which school district coincide with the territorial limits of such city, and where the government of such independent school district is not provided for in the charter of said city, by a Civil Service Board established, or that may be established under said charter.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Employees to be classified.—That the employes of the Board of Education of any independent school district in any city of the first class in the State of Minnesota, the territorial limits of which school district coincide with the territorial limits of such city, and the government of such independent school district is not provided for in the charter of said city, shall be eligible to be classified and shall be classified as employes under the provisions of the charter of any such city, whereby a civil service board has been or may be established.

Sec. 2. Who are employes.—That the term “employes”, as used in this act, shall not include members of the board of education, superintendent of schools, assistant superintendent of schools, clerk of the board, teachers, including principals and supervisors, chief engineer, recreational director, physicians, dentists and temporary employes.

Sec. 3. Clerk to certify list.—That it shall be the duty of the clerk of the Board of Education of such independent school district to promptly furnish the secretary of any such civil service board a list of the employes of the Board of Education of said independent school district, together with a statement of the duties performed by them, and the salaries paid to them, and it shall thereupon become the duty of the civil service board to classify such employes under the rules of said civil service board, said classification to be subject to final approval of the Board of Education.

Sec. 4. Present employes to retain positions.—That employes of any such Board of Education, who are regularly employed by such Board at the time of the classification of the employes by the civil service board as herein provided, shall retain their positions, unless removed for cause.

Sec. 5. Effective on passage.—This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage.
