CHAPTER 367—S. F. No. 991

An act fixing maximum annual expenditures for Mothers' allowances in counties of this State now or hereafter having property of the assessed valuation of not less than \$325,000,000.00, exclusive of money and credits and having a bonded indebtedness not exceeding \$5,000,000.00, inclusive of bonds issued to defray the cost of permanently improving state trunk highways, which bonds the State of Minnesota has heretofore agreed to pay.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Maximum for mothers pensions.**—In all counties of this state now or hereafter having property of the assessed valuation of not less than \$325,000,000.00, exclusive of money and credits and having a bonded indebtedness not exceeding \$5,000,000.00, inclusive of bonds issued to defray the cost of permanently improving state trunk highways, which bonds the State of Minnesota has heretofore agreed to pay, the maximum amount which may be expended in any one year for mothers' allowances under the provisions of Sections 867 to 869, inclusive, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, shall not exceed such a sum as may be produced by a tax levy of nine-tenths of a mill on each dollar of the taxable value of the property of such counties.

Sec. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.
