

to reduce salaries shall apply to all positions and to all salaries, whether fixed by law or otherwise, and whether such salaries are paid from state appropriations, fees, special funds or otherwise, hereby suspending and repealing all laws in conflict with this section.

In all cases where such state departments and activities are subject to the provisions of Chapter 426, Laws 1925, all such reductions in salary shall be approved by the Commission of Administration and Finance, and such state departments and activities shall continue subject to the provisions of said Chapter 426, Laws 1925.

Sec. 13. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 427—S. F. No. 1747

An act to appropriate money for the payment of claims against the State of Minnesota; to provide for tax and other refundments; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of certain employees of the state having claims for personal injuries sustained or for loss or damage of property incurred while engaged in the performance of their duties and for the relief of dependents of certain employees of the State for the death of such employees while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of persons for injuries sustained or for loss or damage to property by certain employees of the State while engaged in the performance of their duties; and by inmates of state institutions; and for relief of dependents of certain employees of the State while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for payments to certain persons for services performed to the State; to authorize the State Auditor to cancel certain land and other contracts heretofore entered into by certain persons with the State and to credit payments heretofore made upon other purchases or to refund the same; to reimburse certain persons for deeds to certain land erroneously conveyed by the State; to authorize the Auditor to credit on certain land contracts the value of improvements found not to be on said land; to provide money for carrying on certain State activities as authorized

by law; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of the game and fish department funds; to authorize and direct certain claims to be paid out of the Rural Credits Department Funds and for other purposes, out of other funds.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Appropriation for miscellaneous claims.**—The sums hereinafter named or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act to be available for the year ending June 30, 1934, unless otherwise specified.

The adjutant general is hereby charged with the duty of delivering the warrants for payment and ascertaining from time to time to whom and for whose benefit such payments shall be made.

That on the payment of the sum that would be legally due upon State Mining Lease or Contract Number 700, covering the Southwest Quarter of Section 36, Township 63, North, of Range 15 West, with interest thereon at six per cent per annum from the date any such payments became due and payable to the date of payment thereof, said payments to be made by the owners of record of said Mining Lease or Contract, or their heirs or assigns, at the time of the taking effect of this act, the State Auditor is hereby authorized and directed to issue and deliver to the owner of said Mining Lease or Contract his certificate or statement evidencing payment of all sums due on said Mining Lease or Contract, and to reinstate said Mining Lease or Contract in the proper records in his office, with the same force and effect as though no default had occurred on said Mining Lease

or Contract, provided, however, that all the payments due and unpaid on said Mining Lease or Contract, if no default had occurred thereon, with interest on said unpaid sums, shall be made on or before December 31, 1934.

If it shall be held by the Court or by ruling of the Attorney General that the jurisdiction of said State Auditor over State Mining Leases or Contracts is no longer vested in said State Auditor, but is vested in the Conservation Commission of Minnesota, then the authority and duty herein vested in said State Auditor shall be exercised by said Conservation Commission.

CHAPTER 428—H. F. No. 1911

An act to amend Laws of 1889, Chapter 403, an act establishing a justice court in the City of St. Paul and to provide for the election of the Justice of the Peace thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Justice courts in the city of St. Paul.**—That Laws of 1889, Chapter 403, be and the same hereby are amended to read as follows.

1. There is hereby established a justice court in the 6th ward in the city of Saint Paul and county of Ramsey in addition to the other justices of the peace of the city of Saint Paul.
