#### STATE OF MINNESOTA EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT

#### **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS by the enactment of Chapter 418, Laws of 1931, the Legislature proposed an amendment to Article 16, Section 3, of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota for the approval or rejection of the electors of the State at the recent election held on the Eighth day of November, 1932, which amendment reads as follows:

"The legislature is hereby authorized to provide, by law, for the taxation of motor vehicles, using the public streets and highways of this state, on a more onerous basis than other personal property; provided, however, that any such tax on motor vehicles shall be in lieu of all other taxes thereon, except wheelage taxes, so-called, which may be imposed by any borough, city or village, and except that the legislature may impose such tax upon motor vehicles of companies paying taxes under gross earnings system of taxation and upon the right to use such vehicles upon the public highways notwithstanding the fact that earnings from such vehicles may be included in the earnings of such companies upon which such gross earnings taxes are computed. Any such law may, in the discretion of the legislature, provide for the exemption from taxation of any motor vehicle owned by a nonresident of the state, and transiently or temporarily using the streets and highways of the state. The proceeds of such tax shall be paid in to said trunk highway sinking fund."

AND WHEREAS it appears from the official canvass of the votes cast at the said election held on November 8, 1932, for and against the aforesaid proposed amendment, made in conformity with

the law that the majority of all electors voting at such election voted for its adoption:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me and in compliance with law, do hereby publish and proclaim that said proposed amendment to Article 16, Section 3, of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, has been ratified and adopted as prescribed by the constitution and laws of the State.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed this 28th day of November, 1932.
