RESOLUTION No. 2

Messrs. Hitchcock, Johnson, D. W., Kozlak, McDonough, Sweitzer, Wahlstrand, Kern and Youngdahl introduce the following Concurrent Resolution:

Resolved by the House of Representatives, Senate concurring, that the Legislature of the State of Minnesota is inexpressibly shocked by the sudden death of Calvin Coolidge, former President of the United States. The nation has lost a great man and the people are bereft of his wise counsels.

The Legislature of Minnesota extends to Mrs. Coolidge its deepest sympathy.

The Chief Clerk of the House is hereby instructed to send a copy of this Resolution to Mrs. Coolidge.

RESOLUTION No. 3

A concurrent resolution memorializing the President of the United States and the Congress of the United States that it is the sense of the members of the Minnesota legislature that the government of the United States should perform its solemn promise and duty and place American agriculture on the basis of equality with other industries by providing an adequate system of credit, and that adequate legislation to that end should be adopted at the earliest possible date.
