CHAPTER 99-S. F. No. 509.

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 6595, relating to the establishment and maintenance of uniform heights of water in navigable lakes situated partly within two or more counties having fewer than one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants each, in order to improve navigation therein, or to promote public health and welfare.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Lakes in two or more counties—water boards.—That Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 6595, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

"6595. Whenever any such navigable lake lies partly within two or more counties having fewer than one hundred and fifty thousand inhabitants each, the chairman of the county boards thereof shall constitute a water board for said counties, and, as such, shall have all the powers and be subject to all the duties in respect to the waters of such lake that are conferred and imposed upon the county board by Sections 6588-6594. And except as otherwise provided in Section 6596, all the provisions aforesaid relating to the raising and retention of the waters in navigable lakes, the acquiring of property therefor, and the assessment and collection of benefits arising therefrom, shall apply to cases wherein such water boards are formed."

CHAPTER 100-S. F. No. 738.

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Sections 10522-1 and 10522-2, relating to protection and conservation of certain wild flowers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Conservation of certain wild flowers.—Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Sections 10522-1, and 10522-2, are hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"10522-1. No person within the State of Minnesota shall buy, sell, offer or expose for sale, the state flower (Cypripedium reginae) or any species of lady slipper (Cypripedieae) or any member of the orchid family trillium of any species, lotus (Nelumbolutea), gentian (Gentiana), arbutus (Epi-
