

## RESOLUTION No. 1. (S. F. No. 15)

*Memorializing Congress to hasten action for seed relief to destitute farmers of the farm districts of Minnesota, and for immediate action for liberalizing regulations governing the distribution of forage and feed relief.*

WHEREAS, conditions in the farm districts of the state are most desperate and much more serious than the general public of the country knows, demanding immediate heroic action if proper seed is to be provided in time so destitute farmers will be in position to take advantage of expected better growing conditions during the coming season, and

WHEREAS, the cutting down of forage relief to a maximum of ten units will inevitably destroy foundation herds so necessary for a comeback of our farmers unless modified at once, and

WHEREAS, the discontinuance of the buying of cattle in conjunction with the limiting of distribution of relief forage unless restored will compel the destitute farmers to destroy the undernourished livestock which will be unfit for the market.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we urge Congress to hasten action of seed programs in order that it may be on hand for early seeding to take advantage of existing moisture, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that regulations be liberalized to meet the urgent needs.

## RESOLUTION No. 2 (S. F. No. 35)

*Memorializing Congress of the United States to appropriate sufficient funds to complete the canalization of the Mississippi River.*

WHEREAS, the United States of America has spent millions of dollars in the partial canalization and construction of a nine (9) foot channel in the Mississippi River, and,
