

RESOLUTION No. 1—H. F. No. 218.

A joint resolution providing for adjournment of the House of Representatives and the Senate from December 21, 1935, to December 30, 1935.

WHEREAS, Under Section 6, Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota, neither House of the Legislature may adjourn for more than three days (Sundays excepted) without the consent of the other House, and

WHEREAS, It is deemed advisable and expedient that an adjournment for more than three days be taken at this extra session of the Minnesota Legislature,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, the Senate concurring herein, that the Senate and the House of the Minnesota Legislature called into session by proclamation of the Governor to be held December 2, 1935, do each with the consent of the other, recess and adjourn on Saturday, December 21, 1935, until Monday, December 30, 1935, at 3:00 o'clock P. M.

RESOLUTION No. 2—H. F. No. 165.

A concurrent resolution memorializing the President of the United States and the Congress of the United States that it is the sense of the members of the Minnesota Legislature that the government of the United States should perform its solemn promise and duty and place American agriculture on the basis of equality with other industries by providing an adequate system of credit, and that adequate legislation to that end should be adopted at the earliest possible date.

WHEREAS, the farmers throughout the entire United States have lost and are losing their lands and chattels through inability to refinance loans and their property because of high taxes and interest rates and low prices of agricultural commodities, and
