attorney in any county to which said order is to apply, the county auditor shall draw warrants for the payment of said clerical help as authorized by said order in the manner provided for payment of other county employees.

- Section 3. County attorney to file order with county auditor.—The county attorney of any county affected by the order of the Judge of the District Court as herein provided for, shall upon the making and filing of any such order file with the county auditor a statement of the person or persons so employed by him to whom the warrants of the county auditor shall be made payable.
- Section 4. Limit of clerk hire.—No order of the Judge of the District Court as herein provided shall be made to authorize the expenditure in any one county of the state of more than \$720.00 in any one year.
 - Section 5. This act shall be in force and effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 335—S. F. No. 1323

An act fixing the salaries of the county commissioners in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Salary of county board in certain counties.—In all counties in this state now or hereafter having a population according to the Federal census for 1930, of not more than 14,000 nor less than 13,000 inhabitants, and having not more than 21 nor less than 19 full or fractional congressional townships, and having not more than 705 nor less than 703 land area in square miles, the salaries of County Commissioners shall be \$600.00 per year to be paid in 12 equal monthly installments.
- Section 2. Inconsistent acts repealed.—All acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith as to the subject matter and the counties herein described are hereby repealed.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
