

RESOLUTION No. 7—S. F. No. 314

Joint concurrent resolution assenting to the provisions of the Bankhead-Jones act.

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States has enacted an act known as the Bankhead-Jones Act, and enacted on the 29th day of June, 1935, being Public-No. 182 — 74th Congress, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the act is to furnish funds to facilitate research into the basic laws and principles relating to agriculture, and to provide for the further development of co-operative agricultural extension work and the more complete endowment and support of land-grant colleges, and

WHEREAS, the provisions of the act make available to the several states and territories certain funds subject to the assent of the states and territories, and

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota, in order to avail itself of its proportions of the funds, desires to assent to the provisions of the act.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota, the House of Representatives concurring, that the State of Minnesota does assent to the provisions of the said Bankhead-Jones Act, and the assent is hereby given, and that the Secretary of State is hereby directed to send certified copies of this resolution to the Honorable John N. Garner, President of the Senate of the United States, and Honorable William B. Bankhead, Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States, and two copies to the Secretary of Agriculture, Henry A. Wallace.

RESOLUTION No. 8—S. F. No. 712

Joint resolution memorializing the United States Senate to ratify, at the instant session of Congress, the treaty between the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada for the building of the Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Seaway.

WHEREAS, the St. Lawrence Seaway Treaty between the United States and the Dominion of Canada, for the development of a sea lane into the Great Lakes remains unratified and, therefore, unfinished business before the country; and
