Whenever the state board of investment shall determine that it is for the best interest of the state to sell such property, it shall direct the state treasurer to sell the same to the highest bidder in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as it may prescribe.

CHAPTER 199—H. F. No. 953

*An act relating to salaries of county commissioners in certain counties; amending Extra Session Laws 1937, Chapter 40.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Salary of county board in certain counties.**—In all counties of the state now or hereafter containing not less than 15 nor more than 16 full or fractional organized townships, and having a population of not less than 10,000 nor more than 11,000 inhabitants according to the last federal census, and having an assessed valuation, exclusive of money and credits, of not less than \$5,000,000 nor more than \$7,000,000, the county commissioners shall receive a salary of \$420.00 annually payable in monthly installments and in the same manner as salaries of other county officers are now paid.

CHAPTER 200—H. F. No. 1019

*An act fixing the salary of county welfare boards in any county of this state which now has or may hereinafter have a population of not less than 20,000, nor more than 30,000 inhabitants, and containing not less than 81, nor more than 85, full or fractional congressional townships.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Salary of county welfare board in certain counties.**—In each county of this state, now or hereafter containing not less than 81, nor more than 85, full or fractional congressional townships and having not less than 20,000, nor more than 30,000 inhabitants according to the last pre-
