

CHAPTER 31—S. F. No. 358

An act relating to salaries of county commissioners in certain counties, repealing Laws 1939, Chapter 208.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Salary of County Board in certain counties.—In all counties in this state now or hereafter having a population of not less than 16,000 nor more than 18,000 population, and an assessed valuation of not less than nine million nor more than ten million, exclusive of moneys and credits, and now or hereafter having a land area of not less than six hundred thirty-eight nor more than six hundred forty-two square miles, the salary of the county commissioners shall be \$600 per annum.

Sec. 2. Law repealed.—Laws 1939, Chapter 208, is hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 32—H. F. No. 119

An act relating to game and fish, amending Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5637.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Law amended.—Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5637, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"5637. Removal of fish from shallow lakes.—The *Director of the division of game and fish* may, whenever after investigation, he finds that any fish are in danger of smothering in winter by reason of the shallowness of the waters inhabited by them, take the same in any manner at any time from such shallow lakes or sloughs, and may transfer such as may be suitable for stocking purposes to other waters in this state, and may sell such as are not deemed suitable by him for stocking purposes, *or the director may, by published order, open such waters to fishing in any manner except with the use of seines or explosives, by residents of the state of Minnesota for personal use only and not for sale.*"
